ESCAPE FROM AFGHANISTAN

Many World Bible School and World English Institute teachers are familiar with our dear S.H. (Study Helper). She has taught thousands, including hundreds converted to Christ from Islam. She has long wanted to travel to encourage her many students, to let them know they are not alone in their dangers and struggles. S.H. arrived in Afghanistan just in time for the crisis that has dominated the news ever since. She was staying with a family of her converts. As the Taliban took over, the Muslim neighbors began to ask, "Who is the American you are keeping? Why is she here?"

S.H. was prepared to die for Christ, but she realized that her presence inadvertently could get others killed. Her presence was attracting attention to her converts, making them targets and placing them in unnecessary danger. In late August, she was at breakfast with her Afghan family, and later described the scene.

As we ate breakfast together and I thought about my presence among them, tears began to flow. Finally, I could not contain it. [I] broke down and cried openly. [They] told me I was not putting them in danger and they wanted me to stay; they would protect me. I blubbered that I wanted to protect them by leaving. So, we "argued" over who got to protect whom, as I boo-hooed.

[Her from inside Afghanistan message continued: Now, they are targeting Americans and Christians. So, included in our family discussion, I told them that one of them may be killed. I reminded them of the ones arrested, tortured, and killed by terrorist Saul and the Christians that fled Jerusalem when Stephen was killed, etc. But I kept hammering home, "You cannot kill a Christian." A bullet will just open up the door to heaven for Christians where they will live life more fully and eternally. I urged them that, if their home is attacked, they are to run when their enemies' corner someone who they will shoot in the next moments. At least the Taliban do not torture, and I told them about Foxe's Book of Martyrs. It is no shame to run. They must run to keep the church alive. Yes, (continued on next column)

they will mourn for the one of them that was killed, and they will be hugely missed, but they must be happy for them also and be prepared to carry on.

Editor's Note: By God's grace and through many prayers, S.H. escaped Afghanistan. That escape involved many harrowing, exhausting experiences, especially for a woman of advanced age. For now, too many lives are at stake, but someday that saga will be told.

A New Year: Time to Take Inventory

As we begin a new year, may we "take inventory" of our spiritual lives. Most businesses or organizations (the ones that are successful) will ask three questions in terms of their direction: "Where have we been? Where are we? Where are we going?" Our spiritual lives are of far greater importance than any business or organization. The church is paramount and is no comparison to some man-made organization or institution. But we can draw a few parallels when taking inventory of our spiritual lives. Second Corinthians 13:5 says, "Examine yourselves as to whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves. Do you not know yourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you? —unless indeed you are disqualified."

Please consider the following questions as we plan our spiritual growth for 2022:

- Am I known as a Christian where I work?
- Is Christ more loved or respected because of the way I live?
- Do I criticize the church and Christians in front of my children?
- Do people know me as one who has Christ in the center of my life?
- Is it possible that I claim to be a Christian and nurse revenge on others?
- Do I find time every day for Bible study?
- Can I work with other people? Can other people work with me?
- Do I have a secret longing to be first? Or can I truly say I do not care who is second, third, or fourth as long as Jesus is first?
- How can I do a better job of leading others to Christ?
- Have I grown as a Christian in knowledge and service compared to three years ago?

As the days roll by this year, may we seek to truly walk with Christ as well as grow closer to Him.
