Mike's Minute

Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn.

Romans 12:15

What do we say to those who mourn? Let me mention 5 helpful things. This list was included in a recent Grief Share newsletter.

1. “I’m so sorry. I wish you didn’t have to go through this.” This simple acknowledgment speaks volumes. You are not trying to fix their pain. You are, instead, simply entering into it with them. This is what it means to “mourn with those who mourn.”
2. “I’m here. You don’t have to do this alone.” Grieving can feel incredibly isolating. Let your friend know they are not alone and they do not have to experience their grief by themselves.
3. “Tell me more about your loved one. I’d love to know more about who they were and what they were like.” Giving them a chance to talk about their deceased loved one honors their relationship and keeps their memory alive.
4. “Would it be ok if I brought a meal this week?” Don’t just offer to help... make your care tangible. Whether it’s food, child care, lawn care, driving them to appointments, or grocery shopping, show love with action.
5. “I’m praying for you. Is there anything specific I can pray for?” Spiritual support is powerful—but it’s even more meaningful when you ask how to pray.

If you are going through a storm today, where have you placed your roots? What is keeping you stable and alive? Sometimes we need to be reminded to keep our roots in Jesus Christ.
