Psalm 34:8

In the Old Testament, the word *blessed* or *happy* comes from a verb that means "to go straight; to advance." The word involves "being in the best place." Biblical happiness is putting yourself in a place where God can bless you.

There is lots of advice in the world about how to be happy. Very rarely does the world's advice square with happiness as presented in the Bible.

The Bible often uses the phrase, "Blessed is the man who..."

What follows this phrase would rarely be recommended by the world. Blessed is the man who... meditates on God's word, has a pure spirit, trusts in God, learns God's precepts, fears God, endures temptation, is poor in spirit, mourns, is meek, hungers and thirsts after righteousness, is persecuted for Jesus' sake.

The happiness-obsessed world will take a pass on these traits! "Be poor in spirit? Mourn? Hunger and thirst after the righteousness of God? Be mistreated for a good cause? No thanks!"

It's *their* loss! God created us. The Bible is the owner's manual for the human body, mind, and soul. I don't know more about happiness than God! Sorry, but you don't either.

Augustine was right when he wrote: "To seek God is to desire happiness; to find Him is that happiness."

In Matthew 18:21-22 Peter asked Jesus how many times could we forgive, and Jesus answered famously with "I tell you, not seven times, but seventy times seven." This seems ridiculous to us. How could I forgive the same person seventy times seven times? Because God has forgiven us infinitely more times than that. We wrong Him every day and He still welcomes us with open arms when we repent. Let's go about our lives with a forgiving heart, always ready to forgive and relieve our hearts of malice, because that's what our Savior did! Plus, we never know when we might need that same forgiveness ourselves when we do wrong or hurt a brother/sister.



Did You Know This About Ruth?

Of all the passages taken out of context, perhaps Ruth 1:16-17 is one of the biggest!

During the time of the judges, an Israelite woman named Naomi found herself a widow. She had left Bethlehem with her husband and two sons to go to Moab, due to a severe famine. While there, her husband died. Her two sons both married Moabite women, and then both sons died. All three women were then widows. When Naomi decided to return to her homeland, one of the daughters-in-law, Ruth, said to Naomi:

"Entreat me not to leave you, or to turn back from following after you;

For wherever you go, I will go; And wherever you lodge, I will lodge;

Your people shall be my people, And your God, my God.

Where you die, I will die, and there will I be buried.

The Lord do so to me, and more also, If anything but death parts you and me."

This passage is read in many modern weddings, but it is not about romantic love. It is about dedicated family love, and also expresses faith and commitment to God.
