Victor Frankl was a psychiatrist and a Jew. While imprisoned in the death camps of Nazi Germany, he suffered unthinkable torture and countless indignities. His parents, brother, and wife all died in the camp or were sent to the gas chamber. Frankl never knew from one moment to the next if his path would lead to the ovens, or if he would be among the "saved" who were forced to shovel the ashes of the ill-fated.

One day, alone and naked in a small room, Frankl became aware of what he later called "the last of the human freedoms"... the control over his inner environment and his basic identity.

He could decide within himself how all of this was going to affect him.

Through a series of mental, emotional, and moral disciplines (largely using memory and imagination) he exercised his freedom, and it began to grow.

Eventually, he felt he had more freedom than his captors. They might have had the liberty to make choices in their external environment, but he had more freedom, more internal power.

He became an inspiration to the prisoners around him, and even to some of the guards. He helped others find meaning in their suffering and dignity in their prison experience.

Others may determine what happens to you on the outside, but only you and God determine your inside fate.
