#### WHY I AM A BROCK PURDY FAN

As you may have heard, there's a little football game coming up on Sunday, February 11. While I am not a fan of the San Francisco 49'ers, after last Sunday's NFC Championship Game, I am a fan of their young quarterback, Brock Purdy.

Purdy's personal story is certainly inspiring. He was chosen in the 2022 NFL Draft at the end of the third day, as the very last player selected, a position that traditionally earns the dismissive title of "Mr. Irrelevant." Purdy was expected to ride the bench as a third-string back up to starting quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo, and his back up, Trey Lance, but when both were injured, Purdy was thrust into the spotlight. The unheralded rookie quickly demonstrated that he was anything but "Irrelevant," putting on a dazzling display and going 5-0 as San Francisco's starting quarterback before being injured himself in last year's NFC Championship Game. That is not why I'm a fan, however.

In last Sunday's game Brock Purdy not only led his team to a victory over the Detroit Lions, and earned a trip to the Super Bowl, but did so in epic style, leading one of the biggest comebacks in NFC Championship game history. That is not why I'm a fan, either.

What impressed me the most about Purdy was his attitude when interviewed after the game. When questioned about his role in the 49er's victory, he said, "Honestly, it's just a testament to God and where He's taken me in life. I've never been the biggest, the fastest, the strongest or any of that."

"I feel like I've always had to fight for what I get and work for what I get. But God's always given me an opportunity whether that's in high school, college or obviously the NFL. Getting drafted last ... all you need is an opportunity and watch and see what He does. I put my faith and trust in Him, and He's gotten me where I'm at."

"When I'm down 17 at half, I'm honestly thinking, 'Alright God, you've taken me here, win or lose, I'm going to glorify you," Purdy said. "And that's my peace, that's the joy, that's the steadfastness – that's where I get it from.... I leaned into that, sure enough, we were able to come back."

In an age in which football players prance and preen on the field over every tackle or first down, and touchdowns are celebrated with ever more elaborate displays of personal aggrandizement and

and braggadocio, it is refreshing to hear this talented young man conduct himself with such modesty, and after the biggest victory of his life (thus far) give glory to God for his opportunities.

Like most of the nation, I plan to watch this year's Super Bowl. I don't have any predictions about whether the Kansas City Chiefs or the San Francisco 49er's will prevail, but I do have one prediction: whether his team wins or loses, I believe Brock Purdy is going to be successful in life.
