For the word of God is living and powerful, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit ... and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart.

Hebrews 4:12

In his book *The Lost Art of Disciple Making*, Leroy Eims describes his struggle with anger. It was not until he made a covenant with God, which included memorizing and meditating on Colossians 3:8 ("You yourselves are to put off all these: anger, wrath..."), that he began to curb and control his anger.

He reviewed the verse daily and asked the Lord to bring it to mind when he was tempted to lose his temper. The Word of God became a sword with which he was able to win his spiritual battle.

Jesus used Scripture in a similar way. When He was tempted in the wilderness after fasting forty days, Jesus resisted every temptation by quoting the Old Testament book of Deuteronomy (Matthew 4:1-11).

If you are in a spiritual battle, your weapon is to be the Word of God, the sword of the Spirit (Ephesians 6:17). If there is a specific temptation you fight, memorize a portion of God's living and active Word to help you win.

Church reformer, Martin Luther, said it well: "The Bible is alive, it speaks to me; it has feet, it runs after me; it has hands, it lays hold of me."
