Luke 18:40-41

A man was standing on a street corner. A dog was standing right beside him. A stranger, who was a dog lover, walked up and asked, "Does your dog bite?" The man answered, "No. He doesn't."

The stranger reached down to pet the dog. The dog snarled and snapped at his hand, narrowly missing it. The stranger jerked his hand back in surprise and fear

"I thought you said your dog doesn't bite!"

The man replied, "That ain't my dog."

Asking the right question is important!


