O LORD. You have searched me and known me.

Psalm 139:1

The philosophers say, "Know thyself." That sounds simple but is actually much easier said than done.

Jeremiah 17:9 says, "The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked; who can know it?"

The Apostle Paul cautions us against being too quick to approve ourselves or condemn others, saying, "I care very little if I am judged by you... indeed, I do not even judge myself. My conscience is clear, but that does not make me innocent. It is the Lord who judges me" (1 Corinthians 4:3-4).

We must be careful of being overly introspective and being too quick to judge others. As fallen creatures with sinful natures, we are capable of wounding ourselves and others with misguided judgements.

Yes, be discerning about right and wrong. Yes, be willing to challenge someone about their behavior when the Spirit leads you to do so. But, always keep in mind that there is only One who can read the heart.

How much better to say with the Psalmist, "Search me, O God, and know my heart; try me, and know my anxieties; and see if there is any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting (Psalm 139:23-24).

Matthew Henry was right when he said, "The best of us are too apt to judge rashly, and harshly, and unjustly; but God's judgment is always according to truth."

It has been a week filled with rain and storms. Earlier this week, there were several tornadoes across the midwest region, and plenty of damage was done. On Monday, my family and I left our home and went to a building with a basement. While we were on the road around 10 PM, with the wind howling around us, I could only think to myself: Jesus just waved a hand and calmed a storm similar to this one. We see the potency of storms and what they are capable of. When the sirens begin to sound, warning of a tornado, our adrenaline spikes, and we are filled with anxiety

How did Jesus respond when he was amidst storms? Mark 4:35-41 tells us! In verse 38, when the storm began, Jesus was sound asleep on a cushion and the disciples barged in to wake him. Can you imagine there being a storm that is threatening your physical well-being and you are sleeping through it without a care? Many of us probably couldn't! Myself included. Yet, Jesus was unfazed. His followers were surely filled with anxiety as most of us would be! They were in a panic. They even asked Jesus in verse 38, "Do you not care that we are perishing?" In response to their fear, Jesus simply arises from his slumber (probably mildly irritated as people often are when their naps are disturbed) and says "Peace! Be still!" It's such an incredible showing of Jesus' power

In verse 40, Jesus then asks them, "Why are you so afraid? Have you still no faith?" Sometimes, we let the storms of life come between us and our relationship with God. We let our fear take control instead of allowing God to take control. If Jesus can wave a hand and halt a raging storm, could He not also calm the emotional or spiritual storms in your life? Could He not guide you through the hardships of life? I believe He can and will if we allow Him to. Just as He delivered His disciples from the storm, He will deliver us from our storms!
