HAVE YOU HEARD THE GOOD NEWS?

News-Ticker: "Today the Pharmaceutical Company Roche has announced, that its research lab has developed a vaccine for the Corona Virus."

Just imagine how a newsbreak like that would be received today: Great relief! Jumping for joy! Hallelujah! After the continually increasing infection rates and mortality statistics, as well as the steady decrease in stock market valuations and economic indicators of the past days, news like this would be extraordinarily good indeed!

This good news, however, could only be accepted in faith for the moment.

It would take some time, before the vaccine could be administered. It would first have to be clinically tested. Then it would have to go into production and finally be distributed. It would indeed take quite a while, before we could go to the doctor for a shot in the arm. And during this waiting period, the virus would of course still be wreaking havoc with our lives, causing sickness and death. But suddenly we'd have hope! Light at the end of the tunnel! Our fear of a helpless situation would be allayed. Anticipatory thankfulness would celebrate a comeback!

Such news in our current situation would be comparable in some ways to the mother of all good news: The good news of Jesus Christ and the kingdom of God. Patient Zero was Adam from Eden. A virus jumped from a snake to a human. It was a very dangerous Cardio-Virus, which was named sin. It attacks the human heart and causes a fattening, hardening and general insensitivity. The symptoms are arrogance, stubbornness, jealousy and selfishness.

Both rates of infection and mortality are exactly 100%: ... just as sin came into the world through one man, and death came through sin, and so death spread to all because all have sinned (Rom. 5:12).

The situation was bleak. Everyone had to reckon with death – and then came the breakthrough. God himself made a house call. He sent his only son with the cure: his own blood. The death and resurrection of Jesus Christ disabled the deadly sting of the virus. This is good news par excellent: sin, death and Satan have lost their bite! All of God's good creation can be healed!

This good news, however, for the moment, can only be accepted in faith.

Even though Jesus has already developed the remedy, we still must wait for him to return and administer it. We are currently still fighting against the sin-virus, occasionally still fall for the devil's lies, and still suffer death. But because we believe the good news, that Jesus has risen from the dead, and because we trust that he is coming back to raise us from the dead, we have hope and confidence – even now, while the virus is still rampant among us.

When the LORD returns, he will transform our bodies into powerful, glorious, immortal virus free versions of our present selves (1 Cor. 15:42-44) and we will be at home in a new Creation, where the sin-virus no longer exists. (Rom. 8:20-23). The virus, its evil author and all those, who chose not to be healed and cleansed of its deadly effects will be put under quarantine in the lake of fire (Rev. 21:8).

Have you heard the good news?

Jesus said: I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world. (John 16:33). The tumultuous rush of events these days may very well be troubling to us, but we of all people can take heart. Despite the dangers and threats, we can know inner peace..., ...when we believe and trust in the good news about Jesus' victory over the curse of the sin-virus and live out our lives in the hope of the resurrection

Last but not least, a practical tip for personal hygiene, while we still remain in this virus infected world: Wash your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded! (Jam. 4:8).

I was given the following tip: If you sing Happy Birthday while washing your hands, you can be sure of having scrubbed long enough. My tip for us all: Pray through "Our Father" while washing your hands. It takes only a bit longer, but the cleansing effect can go much deeper. Unto the heart, where it really matters.

There is no other religion on earth with such a message. This is why we meet on Sunday week after week, because the tomb is empty. This is why we can have victory. This is why we can be free.


