The Pharisees struggled with accepting Jesus as the Son of God, even after He performed miracles never heard of before. Jesus addressed them with strong language and vivid pictures because He knew the hardness of their hearts. He did not attempt to blend their ways with God's ways. He did not cover up or smooth over their inconsistencies. He made it clear where their error was and tried to show them the truth. Sound familiar today?

One of their problems was the master they were serving. While they claimed to be serving God, they were actually serving Satan. They prayed impressive prayers. They tithed to the penny. They fasted frequently. And yes, God wanted them to do these things, but His purpose was that religious observances were to honor Him, not them! Instead, the Pharisees honored themselves and loved the praise of men more than the praise of God.

Another problem was the approach they used. They tried to be righteous by keeping a bunch of rules and regulations. They missed the whole point of the Law, though they claimed to understand it fully. Instead of keeping the Law to the best of their ability as a way to please God, they wanted to establish their own righteousness, by adding details to the Law and even adding laws of their own. This method eased their conscience to justify a hard heart.

Jesus' approach is to work in people's hearts to bring about change. When people truly love God, they are transformed in a way that rules can never accomplish. Then life revolves around pleasing God, not themselves. We have the choice to follow Jesus' way or the Pharisees' way. Let's seek praise from God not man.

You may have seen the recent commercial by the Ad Council that tells us love has no limits. It shows people behind an x-ray screen embracing only showing their skeletal outlines. The people emerge from the behind to reveal they are a same sex couple, to a cheering crowd. The scene is redone with people of different races, religions and ages. Each one is accompanied by the text; love has no gender, love has no race, love has no disability, love has no religion, love has no labels. The ad campaign claims to combat what is seen as bias in our world today.

It got me to thinking about how the world is trying to redefine love. We hear the argument in our world to today, "How a person can be against two people who love one another? To try to put limits on love is wrong."

But how does the Bible label love?

"Love is patient, love is kind and is not jealous; love does not brag and is not arrogant, does not act unbecomingly; it does not seek its own, is not provoked, does not take into account a wrong suffered, does not rejoice in unrighteousness, but rejoices with the truth; bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things" (1 Corinthians 13:4-7).

The world says you should be proud of your lifestyle, but Biblical love does not brag. The world says you are offensive and should be shunned if you don't accept what is acceptable, but Biblical love does not take into account a wrong suffered. The world says you should accept any belief no matter if it is valid or not, but Biblical love rejoices with truth.

There is a saying, "He who controls the language, controls the masses." When it comes to love, who makes the definition, God, who is love, or the world who does not know him?
