Míke's Mínute

Scripture is truly amazing. Each time we come to a passage; we can find a precious new truth that impacts our life. Such has been the case with me recently. This past Sunday, I led us in a study of Luke 8:40-56. In this narrative, Jesus raises a dead girl (Jairus' daughter) and heals a woman from chronic bleeding.

After I finished the sermon and reviewed the text in my mind, another insight occurred to me. One I hadn't seen in my original study of the passage. The insight comes from verses 51 and following:

"When he arrived at the house of Jairus, he did not allow anyone to go in with him except Peter, John and James, and the child's father and mother. Meanwhile, all the people were wailing and mourning for her. 'Stop wailing,' Jesus said, 'She is not dead but asleep.' They laughed at him, knowing that she was dead. But he took her by the hand and said, 'My child, get up.' Her spirit returned, and at once she stood up."

Jesus took only the believers into the house to witness the miracle. The skeptical, scoffing unbelievers were left outside. It's as if the believers needed to separate themselves from the unbelievers for this miracle to occur.

The takeaway? Our environment is so important! There are many in our world who scoff at Christian faith. We must be careful to limit our exposure to such people. During our time with them, we must make sure that we influence them more than they influence us.

This is one of the reasons that being in the assembly to worship God is so important. Being in the presence of believers does us more good than we know.

Be sure to frequently separate yourself from the unbelieving crowd. Get yourself in the "inner circle" of believers... and watch God go to work and do amazing things!

"Gaining in Maturity"

The word "perfection" means maturity sometimes in the Bible. There are several areas we need to become more mature. 
