I have confidence in you, in the Lord.

Galatians 5:10

The German writer, Johann Wolfgang von Goethe, wrote, "Correction does much, but encouragement does more."

My response? Why not both? Correction and encouragement do the most!

When Paul wrote to the Galatians, he began by correcting, even criticizing, his readers for drifting from important principles of the gospel. But Paul went on to also encourage them and express his love and confidence toward them.

Constant correction eventually tears down and demoralizes our hearts. When we are the object of nagging, harping, and criticism, things only get worse. We change course in our lives more quickly when surrounded by people who are both honest and uplifting.

Notice that Paul doesn't just say, "I have confidence in you." He adds an intriguing qualification: "I have confidence in you, in the Lord," He means, "I have confidence in the Lord, that He can work in you what is pleasing to Him."

Let's not be on people's backs all the time. Don't harp and criticize too much. We are called to be the salt of the earth, but the world needs a little sugar too! Let's add some.

Let me lead the way. To everyone reading these words, let me say, "I have confidence in you, in the Lord."
