## HOW WE HONOR OUR FATHERS

Four hundred years later, when the Exodus happened, Joseph's "sons" honored their "father" by doing what he had asked (Exodus 13:19; Joshua 24:32).

Thanking God for the good things our fathers provided is certainly a good and scriptural thing to do (Philippians 1:3-4). This is one way we can honor our dads (Ephesians 6:1–3).
