Míke's Mínute

But I have been the LORD your God ever since you came out of Egypt. You shall acknowledge no God but me, no Savior except me.

Hosea 13:4

I'm currently reading a great book about the Minor Prophets written by Bruce Green, one of the ministers of the 10th Street Church of Christ in Opelika, Alabama. Following are his comments related to Hosea 13:4...

"With all the hype involved in political campaigns (especially those at the national level), it isn't always easy to remember that we're electing politicians rather than saviors. The candidates are everywhere— in televised debates, on late night talk shows, at town hall meetings, in all of the news reports, and in every other commercial. Billions are spent keeping their names before us. They promise security through national defense, strong trade policies, and diplomacy. They assure us prosperity through higher wages, lower taxes, and better health care. It's easy to see them as the answer to all our problems, but it's a big mistake."

"If you've been around awhile, you know that's not the way it works out. The campaign ends, someone gets into office, and the person elected is unable to deliver on most of the promises he made. Shame on him for making promises he couldn't keep, but shame on us for often putting the kind of faith in him that should be reserved for God."

"Israel and Judah weren't any different. Hosea repeatedly tells us how they failed to put their trust in Yahweh and acknowledge Him as the source of their life and blessing. Instead, when the going got tough, they looked to other nations (and their gods) to deliver them."

Trusting other nations and other gods did not work out well for Israel. It won't work well for us either.

Do we *hope* our government performs well? Of course we do! But we *know* our God will perform well. And we put our trust in Him!
