Just Joshín'

I remember, as a kid, when I would be watching tv in the living room and my parents would yell, "Josh, your room is a mess. Clean it this instant!" The moment I heard those words, I would immediately start another episode of a show as an excuse. I did this in an attempt to flee my responsibility. "I'll do it later, but I really can't right now." What a negative mindset, right? Well, I am almost certain that we have all been in a similar state of mind. We dread being asked to do tedious jobs and chores. Many of us despise being given responsibility for something with which we want nothing to do and will do whatever it takes to avoid doing it. Now I raise a question: do we keep this same mentality with God? Have we found ourselves fleeing from God's commands? If so, why? Is it fear? Pride? Whatever the reason might be, if you answered "Yes," then you are in biblical company.

The prophet, Jonah, found himself faced with the command of going into the wicked city of Nineveh and prophesying to them. Upon hearing this, he ran. He responded to God's command with disobedience. We are so early into this story and we already begin to see reflections of ourselves in Jonah. We, sometimes, are afraid of pursuing the path that God asks us to take. The story of Jonah teaches us very quickly what will happen if we try fleeing from God. Midway through chapter 1 of Jonah, we see that God sent a great storm upon the ship on which Jonah was attempting to escape. This storm would not be settled until Jonah gave himself up. Once he accepted his fate and was cast overboard, the storm quieted, and Jonah was swallowed by a great fish. Within this fish, Jonah went to God in prayer and repented, for he had seen the error of his ways.

Following his repentance, he was spat out by the fish and onto dry land. He used his newfound spiritual strength to press on towards Nineveh where he completed the journey God required of him. He told the city that destruction awaited them if they failed to repent and, much to Jonah's surprise, they did! Jonah 3:10 reads, "When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil way, God relented of the disaster that he had said he would do to them, and he did not do it." A city was saved because of Jonah's willingness to fulfill God's will,

even if he fled at first. When we find ourselves turning our backs on God and trying to escape His commands, we should know that God is willing to forgive us. He can make a change in our lives so that we can change the lives of others, just like Jonah.
