Just Joshín'

In our world today, I believe that we tend to view God as only loving and merciful. While this might be true to a degree, it is important to grasp the complete character of God. The book of Nahum picks up where Jonah left off. Jonah taught of God's mercy toward the city of Nineveh when they repented of the sins that the prophet condemned them for. Nahum provides a completely different ending to the wicked city's story and this study will, specifically, take place in Nahum 1:2-3.

We will begin by taking a look at the opening of Nahum. Nahum teaches from the beginning that God is a "jealous and avenging God" in verse 2 of the first chapter. Although we view God in a bright and upbeat manner, I think we would increase our understanding of God by looking at this side of Him. We are told that He has enemies and His wrath will be unleashed upon them. A lesson that we can learn is that we will certainly face adversaries if we commit to following God. However, we carry an understanding of God's power through His wrath and this should give us a feeling of comfort and protection. Our God is a just and righteous God that will not allow evil to triumph.

We should not allow this comfort to blind us to the truth. We must realize that, while God is loving, He will still condemn those who are wicked and turn away from His loving embrace. There is a misconception about God that, because He is loving, he would never condemn and this is simply not true. We should always strive to remain on the right path before God's judgment is extended to us.

This is a lesson that we can learn from verse 2 alone. Thankfully, for us still living in sin, we are provided an upside to God's wrath. If we continue down to verse 3, we are told by Nahum that "The Lord is slow to anger and great in power..." Many of us do not desire to be angry and God is the same way. God's wrath is not without cause. He does not decide on a whim to become angry nor does He quickly become angry. He does not want to be angry but, when provoked, He will demand justice. This should give us comfort because God will grant us time to find repentance when we have done something against His command.

To close, we should certainly have a healthy respect for God. He does love us and desire what is best for us, however, He will not tolerate injustice. We should not take advantage of God's loving nature and simply "put off" repentance. Nineveh strayed away from their repentance and back to wickedness in Nahum and God punished them for it. We should fear God's power but use that fear to build respect to our Creator so that we may love Him more.
