I will have mercy on her who had not obtained mercy; then I will say to those who were not My people, "You are my people!" And they will say, "You are my God!"

Hosea 2:23

A prophet and a prostitute. Talk about an unlikely pair! But that's who God brought together.

Hosea likely would never have chosen the woman who would become his wife. In fact, when God instructed Hosea to marry Gomer, a prostitute, the prophet was likely tempted to run. Remember Jonah fleeing from God's call to go preach in Nineveh? Like that.

God wanted to use the unlikely marriage of a prophet and a prostitute to be an object lesson of his mercy.

God told Hosea to take as his wife a woman who had been unfaithful. As expected, she broke the marriage vows and ended up the slave of another man. So, God told Hosea to go and buy her back and restore their marriage.

This is a true story of God's mercy. A mercy so extreme that it hardly makes sense. We enter into a relationship with God. We then make choices that violate our commitment to Him. And, instead of abandoning us, God pursues us like Hosea pursued Gomer.

Have you made mistakes that have caused you to believe God would never take you back? Open God's Word to the book of Hosea and find out just how much God still wants you as His own!

The French artist Georges Braque (1882-1963) said, "Truth exists, only falsehood has to be invented." Since the truth of God's word was written by men inspired by "the Spirit of truth" (John 14:17), many falsehoods have been invented.

It began early in the New Testament church, with men who were "never able to come to the knowledge of the truth... who also oppose the truth" (2 Timothy 3:7-8). Two thousand years later, falsehoods thrive: the Papacy, the sinner's prayer, instrumental music in worship, women preachers, premillennialism, and a clergy-laity system. These and more are all invented doctrines, none of which are based upon scriptural study.

Solomon said, "Buy the truth and sell it not" (Proverbs 23:23). Sadly, truth has been sold by many, unwilling to search for, or accept God's truth, they "turn away their ears from the truth and will turn aside to myths (2 Timothy 4:4).
