The 2024 Olympics came to an end this last week. The United States won the most total medals in the competition with 126 and tied China for the most gold medals with 40. It is always such a treat to watch over the course of several days, the many athletes who are the absolute best at what they do and cheer on your own country in the process. These competitors have worked their entire lives to reach this grand stage and to earn the right to call themselves the "best" by winning a gold medal.

Sports, in general, have had such an incredible cultural impact on the world and this is not anything new. These various competitions and showcasing of athletics can be traced back all the way to biblical times. Sports were so prominent in the time of the apostle Paul that he used the illustration of a race and runners to symbolize the Christian Walk. In 1 Corinthians 9:24-27, Paul is speaking to the church in Corinth about keeping their "eyes on the prize." Corinth would be the location where the biennial Isthmian games (their version of the Olympics) would be hosted. It goes without saying that sports were clearly a large part of their culture so it makes perfect sense that Paul would use this metaphor.

Christians, whether we are fans of sports or not, can all relate to athletes in some way. Paul claims in verse 25 that "Every athlete exercises selfcontrol in all things." He makes a clarification that athletes, in their competitive pursuits, are striving to obtain a perishable wealth (a championship of some kind or personal glory) while we, as believers, are pursuing an imperishable gift. Athletes train and discipline themselves just as we should do as Christians. We should run this race of life with a main goal in mind: to reach Heaven and to bring as many souls with us as we can. We can only achieve this goal by remaining focused and remembering to not "run aimlessly" as Paul put it in verse 26. It can be a struggle, however. Training is not necessarily easy. It is hard work. We must be willing to endure physical and emotional hardship on this journey to advance the gospel message or we run the risk of becoming "disqualified" (vs. 27) from this perfect reward that God is offering to us!

If you enjoy **quilting**, several ladies meet each Thursday @ 9:00 am in the basement to make quilts.


The **Ladies' Bible Class** meets every 2nd & 4th Tuesday of the month at 6:00 pm in **room 104**.
