Hebrews 9:27-28

The Message

Everyone has to die once, then face the consequences. Christ's death was also a one-time event, but it was a sacrifice that took care of sins forever. And so, when he next appears, the outcome for those eager to greet him is, precisely, salvation.

ALL WILL HEAR HIS VOICE



Do not marvel at this; for the hour is coming in which all who are in the graves will hear His voice and come forth—those who have done good, to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil, to the resurrection of condemnation (John 5:28-29).

The resurrection seems to be a mystery to many people. Death is very familiar to all of us. We all have loved ones who have died and is somewhere in eternity. We are similar to Martha and Mary. When Jesus said to them, "Your brother will rise again," they replied, "I know that he will rise again in the resurrection at the last day" (John 11:23-24). We all have the idea there will be a resurrection. But we have no idea when and how this will take place.

In John chapter five, Jesus is defending His authority as the Son of God. In the process He affirms the resurrection. He says, "The hour is coming when all who are in the graves will hear His voice" (Vs 28). This seem to suggest none will have been raised before that hour. Thus, we are forced to ask, what has happened to all those who have died hundreds of years ago? Are they still in the grave or are they existing somewhere else?

According to James 2:26 when a person dies, his body and soul separates. Thus, the soul must go somewhere, or does it cease to exist? If the soul continues to exist, it must have somewhere to abide. Some will use the story of the rich man and Lazarus to suggest that the soul never dies. The rich man was conscious even after death. He was able to think, talk, and feel after death. This may suggest the soul never dies. It continues to function, even feel torment (Luke 16:19-31).

People will also use Lazarus to suggest that the saved will be taken into Abraham's Bosom where they will spend time till the resurrection. If this is the case, it certainly has an impact on our view of the resurrection. Maybe it is time for us to rethink the resurrection and what will happen to us when we die.

SOLDIERS OF CHRIST

In a book about Seal Team Six, one of the Navy Seals is quoted about their training. He says, "The more we sweat in training, the less we bleed in war." This elite team is credited with the successful raid that killed Osama Bin Laden.

As Christians, we are God's elite fighting force. "Suffer hardship with me," Paul wrote Timothy, "As a good soldier of Christ Jesus" (2 Tm. 2:3). We are reminded that "our struggle is not against flesh and blood," but our war is "against spiritual forces of wickedness in the heavenly places" (Ep. 6:12).

Our training consists of Bible study, prayer, worship, and fellowship with other "soldiers of Christ." The more time we spend in training, the less we bleed in this spiritual war. Satan is "enraged" against the church and is "off to make war with the rest of her children, who keep the commandments of God and hold to the testimony of Jesus" (Re. 12:17). The sure way to lose a war is to not know you are in one. "Therefore, take up the full armor of God, so that you will be able to resist in the evil day, and having done everything, to stand firm" (Ep. 6:13) How is your training going? Or have you gone AWOL? Maybe it is time to re-enlist and get back in the fight.
