There's A Great Day Coming

First, we can *pray*. Before Acts 2 (of course) is Acts 1. What were the believers up to as they waited for Pentecost? They were praying. "They all joined together constantly in prayer..." Please be praying that I will have the courage, conviction, and clarity to present a message on that day that is Scriptural and strong. Also be praying that the message will be heard and heeded by those in attendance.

October 20th will be here before you know it. Let's not just *wait* for it. Let's *work* for it!

Center Fielders News "Be Ready"

In Luke 12:40, Jesus says," You also must be ready; because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect Him." The word "ready" means to be prepared mentally or physically for some action or experience. We use this word almost every day in our vocabulary. When we plan to go on a trip, we say, "Are you all ready?" Or at supper time you might hear these words," Dinner is ready." New Testament verses with this word include Luke 22:23, where Peter declared that he was ready to go to prison and even die for Christ. In Roman 1:15 Paul wrote that he was ready to preach the Gospel, and in Acts 21:13 Paul said that he was ready not only to be bound but also to die for the Lord.

In the title above, "ready" refers to being prepared for the one-time experience of meeting the Lord. As we view the signs of the times, I think we all feel very confident that the Lord's return could be very soon, but only the Father knows exactly when that will be.

Have you ever wondered why Jesus said "Be Ready" instead of "Get Ready"? Because my dear friend, we will not be able to get ready at the time Jesus comes. His coming will be as sudden as a flash of lighting (Matthew 24:27), so there will be no time to make preparation.

What can one do to be ready? Confess your faith in Jesus, repent of your sins, and be cleansed from all unrighteousness by being baptized. Then follow up with an endeavor to live a holy life and to follow all of the teachings of Jesus the Christ. Then you will be ready and be able to say "Come Lord Jesus" (Revelation 22:20) without any fear of being ready. Are you ready?
