God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.

Romans 5:8

Jesus shocked his Jewish audience when he replaced the non-biblical idea of hating one's enemies with the idea of loving them (Matthew 5:43-44). The Jewish tradition of hating enemies had achieved Scripture-like status, a status that Jesus opposed and reversed.

The Apostle Paul takes that teaching to an even higher level when he points out that it would be a rare occasion when someone might die for another person... even a *righteous* person... but even more unheard of for a person to die for an enemy!

I mean, who dies for an ENEMY? Well, God does. God demonstrates his love for us (who made ourselves his enemy by our sin) by giving God the Son to die for us.

So, when God says "I love you," he is saying he chose to love someone who, before being reconciled to him through faith in Jesus, was an enemy. What a shock to the way of the world! The world thinks it's normal to love our friends... but NOT love our enemies. But the love of God is counter-cultural.

God loves both his friends and his enemies. Are there people in this world who are unsaved? Absolutely. But there is no one, not a single person, who is unloved. God loves us all.

If there is someone in your life who has made himself/herself an enemy, surprise him/her with your love!

We were all saddened by last week's event that took place at Apalachee High School in Winder Georgia.
