Therefore, everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock.

Matthew 7:24

Sometimes the hardest thing to do with Scripture is to apply it to your own life. For many of us, it's easier to make the application for other people.

One preacher became acutely aware of this when a church member consistently met him after the service and said, "You sure preached to them today." The preacher dreamed of someday hearing this woman take the message and apply it personally.

One Sunday, he thought he finally had his chance. A severe snowstorm prevented everyone except the preacher and this woman from showing up for morning worship. After the message, he knew she wouldn't be able to make her usual comment. There was no "them" in attendance that day.

She didn't make her standard comment. Instead, she said, "Too bad they weren't all here, because... you sure preached to them today."

Good Bible study involves three questions. The questions must be asked in the proper order for the study to be effective. First, the Bible student must ask, "What does this passage mean?" Second, the student should ask, "What does this passage mean *to me?*" Only then should the student ask the third question, "What does this passage mean to others?"

Let's all determine to take this "me first" principle of Bible study to heart.

Center Fielders News "Individual Accountability"

The Bible teaches us that each person is accountable to God for his or her actions. God does not punish us for someone else's sins, and we can't use their mistakes as an excuse for our own sins. On the other hand, causing an innocent child to sin is a serious offense before God. It is also wrong for someone to tell another that they are not responsible for their sins.

Family traditions were very important to the Jews, but God made it clear that we must not keep a wrong tradition. We can choose not to follow a pattern or a practice of sin. It is far better to follow the Bible than to follow a family practice of unbelief and disobedience. God is a God of love, but He is also a God of perfect justice. He cannot accept those who willfully live in sin.

A typical response from a person being punished is to say, "That isn't fair!" The truth is that God is fair, but we have broken the rules. The solution to inherited guilt is for each person to experience a changed life. One has a choice to reverse their course of sin and rebellion and turn to God. One needs to pray "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me" (Psalm 51:10).

God wants us to be close to Him and experience His full and complete life. But unconfessed sin makes that impossible. In the end, God will judge each person individually for their sinfulness or righteousness.

God invites everyone to serve Him but never forces anyone!

THE LAST BEST HOPE OF EARTH



One month before signing the Emancipation Proclamation, Abraham Lincoln wrote a letter to Congress in which he addressed freeing the country's slaves. In it, Lincoln stressed the importance of doing the right thing to "save our country," which he described as "the last best hope of earth."

I want to borrow and amend Lincoln's words. The family unit in American culture is under attack from many sides: radical feminism, which denies the value of husbands and fathers; gay rights advocates who push for the endorsement of same-sex marriages; divorce and remarriage for any reason; people living together outside the bond of marriage – just to name a few.

Yet, God says, "Unless the Lord builds the house, they labor in vain who build it" (Psa. 127:1). When it comes to modeling for our world what the home should look like, the church of Jesus Christ is "the last best hope of earth."

When we admit that God both knows and wants what is best for us (Psa. 147:5; 1 Pet. 5:7), it should be easier to trust and obey him in everything (Prov. 3:5-8). God wants your family to succeed. He wants your home to be happy and stable. He wants your marriage to be a small taste of heaven on earth. He wants your relationship with your spouse and kids to be healthy and happy. But the key to experiencing all of those things is to build our homes according to his design.

In matters pertaining to the home, God has spoken regarding:

- marriage being between man and woman (Gen. 2:18-24).
- the roles of husband and wife (Eph. 5:22-33).
- the responsibilities of parents to children (Eph. 6:4; Deut. 6:4-9).
- the role of children to parents (Eph. 6:2).
- the importance of intimacy (1 Cor. 7:1-5).

- the eternal consequences of adultery (Heb. 13:4).
- the permanence of marriage (Matt. 19:6).
- acceptable and unacceptable divorce (Matt. 19:3-12).
- the proper conduct of spouses to each other: love (1 Cor. 13), understanding and honor (1 Pet. 3:1-7), calm tempers (Prov. 15:1), and the golden rule (Matt. 7:12).

God has said much regarding human conduct, marital relationships, and family dynamics. We are unwise if we refuse to hear and heed his words.
