Gratitude is a Choice

I hope you had a happy Thanksgiving. It's a good holiday — a day rooted in the idea of giving thanks to God for his blessings.

Whether the traditional story about the Pilgrims and the native American Indians celebrating their harvest together at Plymouth, MA in the fall of 1621 is truly the "first Thanksgiving" or not (since 1970 protesters have gathered at a hill overlooking Plymouth Rock to commemorate a "National Day of Mourning" to protest the traditional belief that the Europeans and Native American Indians had a cooperative relationship), the intent behind the holiday is to encourage us to be grateful to God for his blessings.

We do know that in 1863, at the height of the Civil War, Abraham Lincoln issued a proclamation entreating all Americans to "Ask God to [among other things] heal the wounds of the nation." The final Thursday in November was designated as a day of Thanksgiving. Our nation was sorely divided. It still is

Genuine gratitude, demonstrated by giving thanks is a source of healing – individually and collectively. It requires us to focus on blessings rather than problems . . . positive rather than negative. Thanksgiving is the acknowledgement that we are the recipient(s) of blessings from a source outside ourselves. It's something we are repeatedly reminded to do in the New Testament epistles. It is the basis of our relationship to God.

Develop the habit of giving thanks to God. Every good thing in your life is a gift from him.
