"Living A Soft Answer"

Most likely we have all experienced an incident in which a soft answer could have been a great benefit. Proverbs 15:1 says, "A soft answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger." This verse applies to situations where there is potential for an exchange of angry words. But let's consider another aspect of this verse.

Sometimes we face a situation where someone not only speaks angrily to us but also does things to show that anger. In this case, talking to them is unlikely to do any good. Retaliation will probably just make matters worse. So, what should we do then?

We need to be as kind to that person as they were as unkind to us. By doing this, we "show" a soft answer rather than speaking it. Even if the other person remains angry with us, we can be certain that God will bless the effort that comes from a heart that is filled with godly love. The Bible tells us to live peaceably with everyone around us as much as possible.

The love we show should be without hypocrisy. This is a very important key to living a "soft answer." The Lord Himself said, "Vengeance is Mine, and I will repay." If someone is angry with us, let us first speak a soft answer, and if anger still remains, then let us show a soft answer by being kind. When we do this, we follow the perfect example of Jesus, who demonstrated it in both living and speaking.
