...to keep me from becoming proud, I was given a thorn in my flesh, a messenger from Satan to torment me and keep me from becoming proud. Three different times I begged the Lord to take it away. Each time he said, "My grace is all you need. My power works best in weakness."

2 Corinthians 12:7-8

There is a difference in expecting God to be faithful and anticipating the specific ways He will demonstrate His faithfulness.

The first attitude trusts in God's constancy and wisdom. The second assumes that we know best. If we get the two confused, we are liable to be disappointed in the results.

Even though God always gives believers good things in the long run (Romans 8:28), we will sometimes be disappointed in the short term because He didn't answer our prayers according to our exact agenda.

A passage like the one above does not forbid us from telling God what we want. It simply teaches us to express even our most fervent desires with the underlying understanding that God ultimately knows what is best.

God sees what we can't see. He knows what we don't know. He sees the inside and the outside. The beginning and the ending.

Sometimes the answer to our prayer is delayed. Sometimes, as in the case of Paul's thorn in the flesh, the answer is no. However God responds to our prayers, we can be sure that a much bigger and better plan is in motion.

God's will is greater than my wants.
